I want to thank President Lois Harstein and the very warm and caring Lionesses of her club for greeting and treating us so well. What great work these women do in their community and what a great spirit of working together and with the Laurel Lions

Club. They also support the causes of the District like DLF and LVRF (two more acronyms).

The "Chew, Chew Express" also made a weekend stop in beautiful, sunny (except one day), downtown Rehoboth Beach for the Polar Bear Plunge. Thanks to the great Lions of District 22D, I was able to raise \$1,500 for Special Olympics (total Plunge \$350,000). As I stood shivering on my blanket on the frozen sand waiting for the countdown, I remembered my foolish promise to some clubs to go under the water. I did go in, as you can see from the picture in this bulletin, but I only made it up to my bathing suit. Sorry, but even 47 degree water was still too cold for me! Thank you to everyone who supported this great cause, SODE (another acronym).

Next there is another important acronym that I want to write about and that is LVRF. The Lions Vision Research Foundation at John Hopkins Hospital is badly in need of our District's support. The Lions of Multiple District 22D formed this foundation many years ago. Then in 1994 the five District Governors pledged to support the LVRF with annual funds of \$200,000 each year as operational funds and began an additional \$4 Million Endowment Fund. The good news is that in 2007 the \$4 Million Endowment Fund was fully funded. The bad news is that since 2007 the yearly \$200,000 operational funds from the five Districts has been going down each year. Our District's fair share goal this year was \$26,488.22 and clubs have sent in only \$14,986.00. I know clubs funds are being stretched by the poor economic times. What I am pleading with the clubs to do at this time is consider making a donation to LVRF and if you have already done that, I thank you for doing your fair share. Only 16 of the 35 clubs of our District have made a contribution so far this year. Also, PDG Clyde Bragg who is member of the LVRF Board of Trustees, and I are trying to put together a rally event for LVRF like we do for the Eye Bank, Leader Dog, DLF, and LCIF events that we now have in this District.

I hope to see many of the great Lions of the District at the Leadership School this month in Emmitsburg or at the other District events coming up the rest of this month and in March. Please keep up your efforts in getting new members because we are still down 21 members for the year. And continue to do what only you the caring Lions of your local Lions Clubs can do in your community. That is to SERVE!

Diabetes Corner:

What should my A1C be to avoid complications?



There is no magic A1C number that guarantees you will not develop complications. However, the lower your A1C level, the less likely you are to get diabetes complications. It now seems that even slightly elevated A1C levels carry some increased risk for complications like heart disease and stroke. Unfortunately, very few people can get their A1C levels as low as they are in people who don't have diabetes; we don't have the tools to achieve this goal, and the amount of work and the increased risk of low blood glucose make it impossible for most people to manage. So all people with diabetes carry some increased risk of developing complications.

Trying to be realistic, the American Diabetes Association says people with diabetes should aim for A1C levels of 7% or less. That's the equivalent of a 150 mg/dl average blood glucose. The ADA suggests that you take action and talk with your health care provider about changes in your treatment if your A1C is higher than 8% (the equivalent of a 180 mg/dl average blood glucose). The most important thing to keep in mind is this: Any improvement in your A1C reduces your risk of getting diabetes complications. A small improvement reduces your risk a little, and a big improvement reduces your risk a lot. But every improvement reduces your risk.
