The Feed the Hungry Program is doing great. As I write this we have exceeded 78,000 food items donated to your local food pantries. This has already exceeded my original goal but remember we are now shooting for 100,000 by June 30th. Please report your totals to the District Administrative Assistant, Lion Liz Eitemiller on a monthly basis. In addition to the Feed the Hungry program, Lions in District 22W have contributed 58,497 hours on service projects, serving 21,190 people. Our Lions have also collected 9,472 pairs of eyeglasses, raised \$256,031 and donated \$184,937. These totals are from the Activities report on MyLCI.

Remember Lions Pride Day is on May 3rd. We are asking all Lions to wear your Lions shirts, hats or other items with the Lions logo everywhere you go that day. Have some membership applications in your pocket and try to invite someone new to Lionism. If any clubs wish to do more than this and have a recruiting session in a public place that is the decision of each individual club. Show your Lions Pride on that day and get some new members. There are many ways Lions can become involved, e.g., be advocates with local eye care professionals, obtain training to properly assist the blind and visually impaired, make referrals and inform the public about LOVRNET. LVRF is a multiple district foundation that was established at the multiple district convention in 1988. Everyone should be proud of the research that is being done and accomplishments to date. These services are not available in all states and countries. I hope many of you will band together to help make this project a huge success.

The skiers have varying levels of sightedness with some able to detect light and dark and large shapes, some able to see some detail and depth, and others nearly completely blind.

The Deep Creek Lions bring three groups of students (6 children in each group) to Wisp each winter. The Lions keep the students and volunteers fed throughout the next three days. The Lions Club raises money at events such as its recent Las Vegas Night to fund the program. It becomes a community event with Wisp Resort paying for the lift tickets and rental ski equipment and local volunteers working as guides.



Leader Dog

It all began in 1938 when the Uptown Lions Club of Detroit established a school to train guide dogs for the blind.



On April 4, 1939, the Lions Leader Dog Foundation was incorporated as a Michigan nonprofit. In May 1939, the Foundation leased a small farm in Rochester, Michigan to house their new venture. Fifty dollars per month rented a farmhouse for the students and staff, a barn for the dogs and a garage. Since then, the Lions have acted as the backbone of Leader Dog.

Lions Clubs throughout the world have continued to support the Leader Dog Program. Support has come in the form of donations, identifying potential students and spreading the word of Leader Dog's work and mission. District 22-W supports the Leader Dog Program by inviting a speaker to come to talk to the Lions, Lionesses and Leos annually in each region.

Lion Linda McLane and her Leader Dog, Disney, will come and share her personal experiences with blindness and her life after acquiring a Leader Dog.

Linda was born with glaucoma so she has basically been blind all her life. She graduated from the Michigan School for the Blind and applied for a Leader Dog. She has had her Leader Dog, Disney, since June 8, 2005. With the freedom and independence that her dog has brought her, she enrolled in a two year community college near her home and then transferred to Western Michigan College.

She married and has been blessed with three boys and nine grandchildren. Linda is active in her church and has been a Lion for 17 years. With Disney by her side, she feels confident and safe to walk anywhere that life may lead her. Come hear her story!
