
The pre-school vision screening was both rewarding and successful. Several children were detected needing further vision tests to determine their vision needs.

Lionism in Action; Helping the Community

In our area, projects are generally started and completed along common lines. Example, first comes the need for say a hospital bed and then subsequently other needs become apparent, such as a need for a ramp or lift to give easy access to the home.

Case in point: Lion Pat Murray Lord Baltimore Lions Club (LBLC) called Lion Calvin Denis, Fenwick Island Lions Club (FILC) when he heard about a need in the area for hospital bed. He suggested the LB Lions would furnish the hospital bed and asked if the Fenwick Island Lions could install it.

FILC President Lion Bob Pretty and PP Lion Calvin Denis went to the Park Model Trailer Home of an individual in need, Mr. Mc Keen, and took some measurements. Upon their arrival they were met by his neighbor Mrs. Margaret Bush who had learned of Lionism Services through the newspaper.

Upon taking the measurements, Lions Bob and Calvin realized Mr. Mc Keen could also use a ramp for access in and out of his home. We were told a neighbor had a hydraulic lift to sell. We informed Mrs. Bush the lions could make an electronic vertical lift ramp available (more compact than a ramp) and could also install it.

Following the Mc Keen family agreement to proceed. Lord Baltimore Lions Pat Murray, Charlotte and John Driscoll along with Fenwick Lions Bob Pretty, Calvin Denis, Ted Shepherd, Calvin Hook, Dan Mihalisin, Paul Ravilious as well as neighbors Mr. and Mrs. Bush, Dan Gill and Steve Presgraves worked 10-12 hours installing both the bed and lift.

There were lots of details before the lift could be installed, including removal of a screen. However, this successful project now allows Mr. Mc Keen to move about on his own in an electric wheel chair and enjoy many outside activities. As he did this past summer. Along with the comforts of a much needed hospital bed, Mr. Mc Keen will no doubt enjoy a better quality of life in the future. This project and others like it are a great part of making Lionism a most rewarding experience.

All in all this family should be able to restore some dignity within their lives with this help.

This is what we do. Try to bring a little comfort into the lives of those less fortunate than we.
